The Mashu Kussharo Trail (MKT) showcases the dy namic landscape of the northern part of Akan-Mash National Park with a route that connects crater lakes lava domes, and natural hot springs. The trail also visits sites such as Kussharo Kotan village, an important Aini ural sulfur was mined in the late nineteenth century. The 62-kilometer MKT is an excellent opportunity to learn more about the story of this region.
